

Rosedale Presbyterian Church Choir

The volunteer and professional voices of the Choir of Rosedale Presbyterian Church maintain high standards of choral repertoire, the leadership of congregational singing, and community membership. They are an interesting mixture of congregational leaders, professional singers, and others drawn to a robust musical and liturgical concept of Presbyterian worship. Though the Choir requires music-reading and choral experience, new members can enter through a beginners' program in which the basic skills are developed and encouraged before one commits to the musical level needed to maintain full membership. The group has been directed by Christopher Dawes since 2016.



Alice Malach, Artistic Director



Over the past 25 years, Alice Malach has developed a passion for rehearsing and conducting choral ensembles. She was first introduced to choral music through the inspirational teaching of Mary Legge at Earl Haig Secondary School, where Alice attended the Claude Watson School for the Arts as a piano major. This led to choral conducting studies at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Music with Doreen Rao and Wayne Strongman, and summer choral studies at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey.

As an accomplished pianist and conductor, Alice has worked with numerous children's choirs through the Toronto District School Board, the Royal Conservatory of Music, and the Glenn Gould School. Through a long-term affiliation with Toronto's Jewish choral community, Alice has conducted Temple Sinai's youth choir and has worked as both adult choir director and accompanist for Temple Emanu-El. Alice taught for many years with the Toronto District School Board, including at Northlea Elementary School, where she directed their award-winning choirs. She is currently the Head of Music at Havergal College in the Upper School, where she teaches yocal music and directs three choirs.

Alice holds an Artist Diploma in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the Glenn Gould School, an A.R.C.T. diploma in Piano Performance, a Kodaly Pedagogy Certificate, and recently completed an MA in Music Education. In 2014, Alice was nominated by the Ontario Arts Council for the prestigious Leslie Bell Prize for Excellence in Conducting.

Christopher Dawes, Director

Christopher Dawes is an active and soughtafter performer, conductor and consultant active principally in the worlds of choral and church music. His work is heard frequently across Southern Ontario, both as a solo artist and with some of the region's foremost ensembles and institutions. He is a two-decade collaborator with the Instrumental and Choral Conducting programs of the University of Toronto's Faculty of Music, Artistic Director of the Marion Singers of Greater Toronto, and a



leading and a leading figure in the Southern Ontario Chapter of the Hymn Society of the United States and Canada, and Canada's Summer Institute of Church Music. He lives in Georgetown, Ontario with his wife Marcia, their three children and two dogs.



Scott Metcalfe, piano

Scott Metcalfe is one of the most soughtafter piano players on the Toronto music scene. Coming from a classical and jazz background in Winnipeg, Scott Metcalfe moved to Toronto in 2002 to study jazz at Humber College. Since then his palette has expanded and he continues to perform throughout Toronto and the GTA as well as across Canada. In addition to playing original contemporary jazz compositions in his own trio, Scott accompanies many

singers and artists in a wide variety of styles. He has recorded on numerous CDs and has also worked as the arranger/producer for a handful of jazz-RnB artists including Jordana Talsky and Ori Dagan. Scott's interests include teaching students of all ages as well as accompanying dance performances from flamenco to ballet to moving meditation. Scott is always looking to expand his musical style and improve his craft as an accompanist, band leader, producer, and just plain music lover.

Mary Legge, Founding Artistic Director

In the fall of 1997, when Mary Legge retired from an active career as the Director of Choral Music in the Claude Watson Programme for the Arts at Earl Haig Secondary School in North York, she founded the Penthelia Singers with a group of enthusiastic alumnae of the Earl Haig Girls Chamber Choir. The debut concert was performed on May 3, 1998 at Rosedale Presbyterian Church. A variety of songs in Finnish, German, Japanese, Latin, Romanian, Welsh, West Georgian and, of course, English, tended to establish the linguistic characteristics of future performances.

Mary challenged this choir with a diverse variety of repertoire. The disparate characteristics of Bach Cantatas, Opera choruses, Broadway songs, works in graphic notation as well as repertoire in at least 22 languages required a singer's imagination and vocal resilience to be at ease in these demanding styles. She often championed Canadian compositions and women composers.

After 10 years at its helm, Mary retired as Artistic Director of the Penthelia Singers and passed the torch to one of her former students, Alice Malach. Mary continued to be part of the Penthelia community by being a mentor to Alice, guest conducting, being an extra ear at dress rehearsals, and being one of our biggest fans.

Born and raised in Muskoka, Mary spent her adult life in Toronto, where she taught school for over 35 years. A graduate of University of Toronto, she had a rewarding career as a devoted music educator, church organist, and choral adjudicator. She sang with the Mendelssohn Choir and was a Royal Canadian College of Organists Board member. Mary was an avid gardener, a keen member of the Imperial Order Daughters of the Empire, an enthusiastic lawn bowler, and a proud Canadian.
